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

SwissCommunity supports Swiss people with regards to cross-border mobility and promotes exchange between the country and its diaspora. It is aimed specifically at young Swiss people living abroad.

The Organisation of the Swiss Abroad represents the interests of Swiss citizens living abroad vis-à-vis the Swiss authorities and the public at home. The mouthpiece of the Swiss diaspora is the Council of the Swiss Abroad, which is elected by the Swiss communities abroad.

It informs its compatriots abroad about important events and developments in Switzerland. We supply those living abroad who are eligible to vote with the basic information they need to exercise their political rights in Switzerland.

It networks Swiss nationals abroad with each other and with authorities, institutions and the public in Switzerland. To this end, we work particularly with Swiss associations and institutions abroad.

It advises Swiss nationals about issues related to emigration, staying abroad and returning to Switzerland. Together with our partner organisations, we provide Swiss nationals abroad with a wide range of services.

St. Gallen, August 19, 2023 – In this election year 2023, the Organization of the Swiss Abroad (OSE), SwissCommunity, organized the 99th Congress of the Swiss Abroad in St. Gallen.

Saturday morning was entirely devoted to the federal elections. Representatives of six major Swiss parties have taken a position on the main political demands of the Fifth Swiss in front of the almost 100 Swiss abroad present. The afternoon has been reserved for the theme of Swiss culture as an export product, which made it possible to discover the diversity of the cultural landscape of the Swiss abroad.

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Interview with Consul General Daniel Freihofer

Daniel grew up in the eastern part of Switzerland, partly in St. Gallen and partly in Appenzell. Interested in international politics and international political economy, he chose to continue his studies in international relations in the French speaking part of Switzerland at the Graduate Institute of International Studies in Geneva in 1996. He spent 5 years in the Suisse Romande where he met his wife, Ylva, a Swedish national working and learning French in Geneva at the time.

After taking a year off and backpacking in South America in 2002, Daniel did an internship at Roche pharmaceuticals in Buenos Aires providing him with first hand experience with a Swiss company abroad. After returning to Switzerland, Daniel joined the State Secretariat for Economic Affairs (SECO) in Bern.

Daniel's first position with SECO was Desk officer for bilateral economic relations in the Asia/Oceania Division. This gave him the opportunity to frequently travel to Southeast Asia and experience the culture of many





countries in the region, including Hong Kong. In 2007, Daniel took on the position as Head of the Economic and Trade Affairs Division of the Swiss Embassy to India and Bhutan in New Delhi. During their 5-year posting in India, Ylva and Daniel had their first child Theo.

Returning to headquarters in Bern in 2011, Daniel became Deputy Director of the Free Trade Agreements/EFTA Division at SECO coordinated the negotiation of free trade agreements with several partner countries in Asia, South America and Africa. Their second child Lia was born beginning of 2014. Later that year, he was assigned to Washington D.C. as Minister and Head of the Economic, Trade and Financial Affairs Division of the Swiss Embassy to the United States of America where he spent the next 5 years of his career. Loving the American way of life, Daniel and his family visited 46 out of 50 states on their travels.

After officially switching from SECO to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 2019, Daniel was assigned to Kinshasa as Deputy Head of Mission of the Swiss Embassy to the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC).

Following a 3-years assignment in Congo, Daniel and his family were given the opportunity to return to the Far East, where Daniel now acts as Consul General of Switzerland in Hong Kong and Macao.

Daniel and Ylva's first born, Theo is 14 years old and enjoying the freedoms Hong Kong offers of being a teenager. Their second child, Lia is almost 10 years old. Both children are attending GSIS and following the German stream. They both love sports, in particular soccer and skiing.

Daniel is an avid tennis and golf player. He also loves the outdoors and will take advantage of the vast number of hiking trails that Hong Kong has to offer.

The Freihofer family are also "foodies" and are looking forward to experiencing the wonders of Cantonese cuisine and other Asian cuisines while posted here in Hong Kong.

Daniel and I talked about what are some of the things that he would like to focus on during his assignment here in Hong Kong.

In addition to the comprehensive range of consular and visa services provided by the Consulate General of Switzerland in Hong Kong, Daniel and his team would like to give more visibility to the many Swiss success stories here in areas like business, finance, science & education, hospitality as well as culture. Daniel's goal is to further strengthen the bilateral relations between Switzerland and Hong Kong in these areas over the coming years. The Swiss Consulate has already kicked off a series of "Hong Kong Swiss Collaboration Workshops" jointly organized with the Financial Services Development Council of Hong Kong.

During Daniel's first few months since taking up his position, he has already noticed a positive "post covid reset" effect with increased interest and Swiss delegations visiting the city. Daniel wants the Swiss Consulate to act as a door opener for Swiss businesses and institutions supporting them in their endeavours and linking them with potential partners. The Swiss Consulate very much appreciates its close collaboration with the Swiss Association and Swiss Chamber of Commerce in Hong Kong.

Daniel's ambition is to provide a first class and hand-on service to the Swiss community in Hong Kong and to boost the already impressive Swiss footprint even further over the coming years.

Interview with Françoise Killias Zillweger Deputy Consul General

Daughter of a diplomat, Françoise has been used to living abroad. Having completed her primary education in New Orleans, USA, she returned to Switzerland with her family for about 10 years as her parents wished that she would grow up and continue her education there. Her parents were then posted for the first time in Hong Kong in 1985. Françoise's father was Consul General at the time. Having completed secondary school in Switzerland, Françoise decided to complete her last year of high school at the French International School in Hong Kong where she received her baccalaureate. Instead of going to University, she joined the Foreign Ministry in Bern as Assistant. Beginning in 1991, She was assigned to posts in Poland, Brazil and New Zealand. She married and had her first and second son in Brazil and New Zealand respectively, Lucas and Alec. In 1998, Françoise and her family moved to Bonn, Germany where she took an examination to move to the consular field. They then moved to Uruguay where she continued in the consular section. The family then moved to Greece where their third son, Théo was born. Having spent three years in Greece, the family moved to San Francisco. In 2008, Françoise was then posted to Hong Kong in the consular section as Head of Chancellery, her second time living in the city. Having spent 4 years in Hong Kong, the family finally moved back to Switzerland following 21 years of being abroad. Françoise then worked for the Crisis Management Center for the Foreign Ministry in Bern. Her role was to support and assist embassies and consulates abroad to prepare in the event of a crisis. Following a four-year assignment in Bern,



Françoise and her family moved to Shanghai in 2016 as Head of Chancellery. In 2020, Françoise and her family moved to Cuba. She was head of personnel, finance and administration focusing on humanitarian projects within the country. Here in Hong Kong, her role has expanded to culture, science & technology and human rights.

Françoise was motivated to join the Foreign Service since she loves to travel, meet new people, experience new cultures and of course was strongly influenced by her father being a diplomat as well. In her free time, she loves to hike and is looking forward to explore all the various trails that Hong Kong has to offer. Walking back and forth to work via Bowen Road from Happy Valley to Wanchai has become her daily routine. She enjoys going to live concerts which she plans to do here in Hong Kong and Macau.

Françoise's goal in her new role is to further enhance Switzerland's fine reputation by showing people the dynamism of the country beyond its reputation of having the finest chocolate and cheese and one of the world's most successful tennis players, Roger Federer. She wishes to further strengthen ties between Switzerland's universities and work closer with Swissnex in Shanghai to bring "Swissness" to Hong Kong and Hong Kong culture to Switzerland. Françoise looks forward to engaging with the Swiss community in Hong Kong.



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In the Spotlight with Marco Foehn

On a sunny September afternoon along the coast of the South China Sea, I had the pleasure of meeting Marco for a few hours over a lovely lunch.

Marco, born in Altdorf, Uri, one of the three original cantons of Switzerland, completed a commerce apprenticeship. A bachelor at the time, Marco was in search of adventure and found it in the Far East. An opportunity to work on the trading floor of a Swiss Bank in Singapore came up, and he jumped on it. Not looking back, it was the beginning of a lifetime in the exotic Far East. It was the spring of 1981.

The Swiss Club in Singapore or originally The Swiss Rifle Shooting Club was one of his first impressions of the Far East with its traditional colonial white dressed members. As the majority of its members brought their families, Marco was politely reminded to "Be careful" as a bachelor in such an exotic country.

The Bank, needing someone urgently in Hong Kong, requested him to transfer there, which he did in the spring of 1982. A few years later, he was given the opportunity to return to Switzerland as a trainer in the head office. Marco rejected this offer, preferring to remain in Hong Kong. The attraction to remain in Hong Kong was the combination of the mountains, the sea, the climate, and the ease of blending in with the local people and culture.

He served the German Swiss International School (GSIS) Finance Committee first as a member in 1994 and from 1997 till 2003 as its Chairman and navigated the school successfully through the Asian Financial Crisis. He was elected Chairman of the Board in 2000 and laid the foundation for the first strategic plan. In 2002, Marco left the banking industry at the young age of 47 and fully concentrated on the board and chairmanship of GSIS,



Seeing that the facilities of GSIS were no longer competitive with relation to other international schools operating in Hong Kong, he recommended that the school is doing a complete overhaul of all its facilities.

After stepping down as Board Chairman in 2003, he served the school as its Building Chairman responsible for the implementation of the School Redevelopment Plan and later in 2011, Marco was offered the position of Chief Operating Officer (COO) at GSIS, coinciding with the start of the renovation.

In March 2017, Marco resigned from his position as COO, while unluckily days later he suffered a stroke. That closed a chapter that lasted for nearly 25 years.

Following a 100% recovery, Marco has been on the board and advisor of two International Schools in China, namely Utahloy International School in Guangzhou and Zengcheng.

Many other Swiss, like Marco, have chosen Hong Kong to settle down and live for many years. A strong bond of friendship and community has been established amongst these "Old China Hands" who join each other for a monthly "Jass" evening and dinner at the Swiss Chalet. In addition to card playing, these friends often get together on hiking and biking trips to spend time venturing as far as Nepal, Pakistan, Cambodia, Laos, and Thailand.

Married to an Indonesian Chinese for nearly 40 years, Marco and his wife, Alice, have three grown up children, one in Hong Kong and one in the United States and one who lives in Chiang Mai. Four grandchildren all together, two in Hong Kong and two in the USA. Marco is amazed by the contrasts in the different educational upbringing of the grandchildren,

whether they be in an Asian or Western culture and society.

While Marco enjoys returning to Switzerland on holiday to visit relatives and friends, if he has the choice, he will remain in Hong Kong.

From all of his experiences in the Far East and back home, Marco has the following message for our readers:

"Try not to talk about age, try to talk about, what can I do today? And do it. Don't complain that today is too cold or today is too hot. Just do it! "Encourage others to do things. Come on, we will do it together."

"It's never too late to learn something new."

This comes from a man, at the age of 69, who is still doing Rock Climbing this year at the Swiss Association of Hong Kong's event. Bravo!






The annual single membership fee is HK\$ 250 and family membership fee is HK\$ 450.
